Draw a flower on cardboard and cut out.

Each bouquet will consist of 3 cut cardboard pieces.

Use the first cut flower to trace and make patterns to complete multiple flowers.

4



Cut slots in the free flower bulb and notch of second set of leaves

5



Paint your flowers! Use any color that you like.

6



Join the pieces of your painted flowers together!
